Reading Passages	Exam	2 Hours	Candidates read two passages and answer three questions. This exam is set and marked by Cambridge.	50% of total marks
Directed Writing and Composition	Coursework Portfolio		Candidates submit three assignments. This component is assessed by the teacher and moderated by Cambridge.	50% of total marks

Cambridge IGCSE English Literature 0486 2018

Poetry and Prose	Exam	1 Hour 30 mins	Candidates answer one question on the set novel (<i>Spies</i> by Michael Frayn) and one question on poetry (from the anthology <i>Songs of Ourselves</i> Volume 1 Part 5). This exam is set and marked by Cambridge.	50% of total marks
Drama	Exam	45 mins	Candidates answer one question on <i>Macbeth</i> by Shakespeare . This exam is set and marked by Cambridge.	25% of total marks
Unseen	Exam	1 Hour 15 mins	Candidates answer one question requiring critical commentary on either an unseen extract of literary prose or an unseen poem . This exam is set and marked by	25% of total marks
