


# English Literature Exam

## Brevet

### Oral in English

- ▶ Preparation in class to compliment the study of *Of Mice and Men* and *A View from the Bridge*
- ▶ Students prepare a dossier on the exploration of the American Dream in these texts and two other sources of their choice.

- ▶ They are assessed on their level of English Language for the Brevet oral and are given a grade for their work on the project, including their performance in the oral, for the bulletin.
  - ▶ Brevet grading: presentation (well structured, in depth etc.), interaction and questioning and oral expression (syntax, vocabulary etc.)


# Course Content
